COVID-19 RELEIF PROGRAMS

Town of Moraga Small Business Grants Awarded

The Town of Moraga launched the [Small Business Grant program](#) in April 2022 to provide relief to Moraga businesses that have been impacted by COVID-19. To date, the Town has awarded 30 small business grants totaling \$150,000. The grant funds were approved by Town Council as part of the Town's American Rescue Program Act (ARPA) funding allocation. The small business grants provide up to \$5,000 in direct COVID-19 relief to assist local businesses impacted by economic hardship from the pandemic to assist with economic recovery.

CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECT UPDATE

Moraga Library – Exterior Paint

The Moraga Library received a fresh coat of paint this week as part of the Fiscal Year 2021/22 Capital Improvement Program Municipal Facilities Painting Project which also included painting of the Moraga Commons Park Bandshell and the Casita Building at the Hacienda.

Moraga Commons Park – Irrigation

Replacement of the Irrigation system at Moraga Commons Park is underway as the Town works to install a modern and efficient system throughout the park. As work continues, portions of the park may be unavailable on weekdays, as work is scheduled to continue Mondays - Fridays through early June.



HACIENDA DE LAS FLORES IMPROVEMENTS

The Town hosted an Open House at the Hacienda de las Flores to highlight numerous site improvements recently completed through private investment in the aging facility. Wedgewood Weddings has partnered with the Town for event management of the private weddings and events hosted on the property. Since commencement of the lease on November 1, 2022 Wedgewood has made over \$300,000 in site improvements on the property.
