TREE LIGHTING CEREMONY- THURSDAY, DECEMBER 1

Join your friends and neighbors for the return of a time-honored holiday tradition in the Moraga community! STORM PREPAREDNESS AND SANDBAG STATION

Self-service sandbags are available at no charge to Moraga residents at the Rancho Laguna Park parking lot (2101 Camino Pablo). Please take only what you need and fill bags one-third full for stacking. Moragans are encouraged to plan ahead for winter storms. Here are a few tips:

- Inspect drainage inlets, gutters, ditches, pipes, and creeks on your property and remove any debris that may be blocking the flow of water.
- Visit the [FEMA Flood Mapping Center](#) to look at flood maps of your area.
- Learn about the Contra Costa County Flood Control's [7-5-3-2 Flood](#) forecasting tool to warn of potential flooding periods.
- Plan for food, water, medical and personal comfort needs for each household resident and plan an evacuation route in case of fast-rising water. Visit [Ready.gov](#) for more information.

PROCLAMATION HONORING TOWN CLERK MARTY MCINTURF



TOWN MANAGER RECRUITMENT BROCHURE

WELCOME INTERIM TOWN MANAGER BRIAN DOLAN

The Council adopted an Employment Agreement with Brian Dolan. Brian has 35 years experience working for local government, most recently serving as the City of Pleasanton's Assistant City Manager. Brian is also a 20 year Moraga resident. Brian will begin work on January 3, 2023 and serve until a new Town Manager starts.

GENERAL PLAN AMENDMENTS AND SAFETY ELEMENT AMENDMENTS

The Council received a report on the proposed General Plan and Safety Element Amendments that will be included as part of the Housing Element adoption in January 2023. The proposed updates to the General Plan focus on compliance with recent State laws, consistency with the updated Housing Element and proposed zoning changes (including the rezone of the Bollinger Canyon area), safety element updates, and traffic circulation updates to incorporate Vehicle Miles Traveled (VMT).

PROPOSED AFFORDABLE HOUSING ORDINANCE

The Council heard an overview of the proposed Affordable Housing Ordinance that the Planning Commission recommended for adoption at their November 14 meeting. The proposed Ordinance requires all new residential development in the Town to include 10% affordable units. More specifically, 10% of for sale units must be affordable to moderate-income households (those that make less than 120% of the Area Median Income (AMI)), and 10% of rental units must be affordable to low-income households (those that make less than 80% of the AMI). Low density residential developments can opt to meet the affordability housing requirement by constructing Accessory Dwelling Units in 25% of the homes. The Public Hearing to consider adoption of the Ordinance is scheduled for the December 7, 2022 Special Town Council Meeting.

DRAFT ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT REPORT (DRAFT EIR)

The Town Council received a report and accepted public comment on the Draft EIR for the Comprehensive Advanced Planning Initiative. View the [PowerPoint presentation](#). The EIR is a "Program" EIR meaning that it evaluates a series of future actions that are connected with the adoption of certain policies, regulations, rules, and plans. Individual development projects will still be subject to future environmental review but may rely on the Program EIR for the evaluation of impacts that are not site-specific in nature.

REVIEW OF HCD'S COMMENTS ON DRAFT HOUSING ELEMENT

The Council received an overview of the comments from the State Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD) on the [Town's Draft Housing Element](#) submitted on August 12, 2022. HCD's letter can be found [HERE](#). The Town will need to respond to all comments and adopt the Housing Element by January 25, 2023 to avoid penalties such as "Builders Remedy" which would limit the Town's authority to deny qualifying housing projects, among other things.

MORAGA ROAD AND HACIENDA DRAINAGE PROJECT

The Town Council approved amending the contract with Anchor Engineering for an additional \$25,000 for Construction Management and Inspection Services for the Moraga Road and Hacienda Drainage Project (CIP 21-206). Additional funds are needed to address the lengthened construction schedule, additional time analyzing changes in the storm drain repair methodology, and administrative time to close out the project and will be offset by construction cost savings. ANNUAL STORM DRAIN REPAIRS PROJECT DESIGN WORK TO BEGIN


The Town Council accepted the 2021 – 23 Annual Storm Drain Repairs Basis of Design report recommendations to complete the design for the repair of 22 high-priority storm drain pipe segments. Staff with the consultant, Harris and Associates, will inspect nearly 30,000 linear feet of the public storm drain pipelines, including the remaining corrugated metal pipes, which are highly susceptible to failure. TRAVEL TO FEMA EMERGENCY TRAINING

The Town Council authorized the Town's Associate Civil Engineer to attend the upcoming FEMA E0273 Managing Floodplain Development course at the Emergency Management Institute in Emmitsburg, Maryland. The course is by invitation only and focuses on understanding and managing floodplains in order to protect our community. All travel and course expenses to attend the course are to be paid by FEMA.

PROCLAMATION DECLARING UNITED AGAINST HATE WEEK

Town Council declared November 13 to 19, 2022 United Against Hate Week in Moraga. The Town has committed to showing support for all members of our community and standing together in opposition to bias, bigotry, and intolerant treatment. LAGUNA CREEK RESTORATION UPDATE

The Laguna Creek Restoration Project is close to approval from FEMA to proceed with Phase 2 – completing the engineering design, bidding, and construction of the proposed creek restoration project at the historic Hacienda Park. The project's 65% Plans and Environmental Studies are being reviewed for environmental compliance and conformance with the grant requirements by FEMA for Floodplains/Wetlands, and U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service for ESA, and a consultation with local tribes and the State Historic Preservation Officer.
