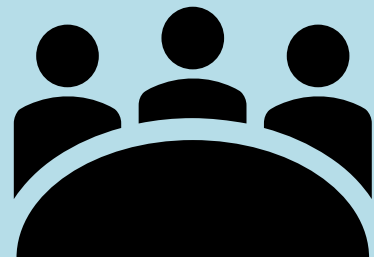

JOINT TOWN COUNCIL AND PLANNING COMMISSION STUDY SESSION



SUSTAINABILITY IN THE 2040 GENERAL PLAN AND PROPOSED ADJUSTMENTS TO THE GENERAL PLAN ORGANIZATION

Staff is in the process of updating the General Plan 2040 with a proposed Sustainability Chapter. Council and Planning Commission provided high level feedback on the importance of sustainability and climate resilience as themes to be carried through out all General Plan

elements. The overall direction was to continue to support the development and improvement of Moraga Center and Rheem Center with high density mixed use development that is walkable and connected. Direction was also provided to make adjustments to the General Plan organization.

DRAFT 2040 GENERAL PLAN COMMUNITY DESIGN ELEMENT STUDY SESSION

Staff is in the process of updating the General Plan 2040 with a proposed Community Design Element. Council and Planning Commission provided high level feedback on revitalization focus on Moraga's two commercial districts, Moraga Center and Rheem Center. There was an acknowledgment of the need for more diverse housing types, revitalized commercial areas, and sustainable development. The staff/consultant team has proposed revisions to the existing Community Design Element that support the vision of Moraga as a community with vibrant, walkable town centers, as well as high-quality lower-density neighborhoods and protected open spaces.

CCTA AWARDED NEW GRANT FOR EVACUATION STUDY



The Town of Moraga is pleased to announce that we are the recipients of a CalTrans grant in the amount of \$1,490,000 for a Countywide Emergency Evacuation Plan with Contra Costa Transportation Authority (CCTA).

This will allow Moraga and all 19 Contra Costa cities and unincorporated county to conduct a county wide evacuation model. This Plan will conduct local level evacuation compliance assessments (per Senate Bill 99) and a high-level evacuation route capacity, safety, and viability analysis (per Assembly Bill 747). **The grant will allow for multi-jurisdictional cooperation in developing evacuation analysis and dynamic modeling.**



LAFAYETTE – MORAGA REGIONAL TRAIL RESTORATION

A project lead by East Bay Regional Park District (EBRPD), Moraga Regional Trail is going through a restoration between Winchester Dr. and Canyon Road Bridge. EBRPD will handle notifications via mail, signage and on NextDoor. Below is some basic project information:

- **Tentative Start date:** August 5th, 2024
- **Tentative Completion Date:** September 30th, 2024
- **Project Summary:** The project consists of reconstructing a new 450 ft by 12 ft wide section of concrete paving on the Lafayette-Moraga Trail that will reconnect Westchester Drive to Canyon Road and will also include the installation of new chain link fencing

YOUR GUIDE TO RUNNING FOR MORAGA TOWN COUNCIL



 **ELECTION DATE:**
Moraga will conduct a Municipal Election on Tuesday, November 5, 2024.

POSITIONS AVAILABLE FOR THE 2024 ELECTION:

- Three (3) Town Council Members

QUALIFICATIONS FOR OFFICE:

- U.S. Citizen
- 18 years of age or older
- Registered voter living in the Town of Moraga

GETTING STARTED EARLY:

- Review the Fair Political Practices Commission (FPPC) Campaign website at www.fppc.ca.gov.
- File FPPC [Form 501 Candidate Intention Statement](#) with the Town Clerk before receiving contributions or spending your own funds.
- Open a bank account if you plan to receive contributions from others or you plan to expend personal funds totaling \$2,000 or more. All money used for campaign purposes, including the candidate's personal funds, must be deposited in the campaign bank account prior to the expenditure.
- File FPPC [Form 410 Statement of Organization](#) with the Secretary of State within 10 days of receiving \$2,000 in contributions. File a copy of Form 410 with the Town Clerk.


CANDIDATE FILING PERIOD

The filing period begins on July 15, 2024 and ends on August 9, 2024. If an incumbent does not file by August 9, the filing period will be extended to August 14, 2024 at 5:00 pm, for candidates other than the incumbents.

A Candidate Handbook, including Official Nomination Papers and Campaign Filing information, will be available by [appointment with the Town Clerk](#) beginning July 15, 2024.

Nomination in 3 Easy Steps:

- 👉 **STEP 1:**
[Contact the Town Clerk](#) for an appointment July 15 through August 9.
- 👉 **STEP 2:**
Complete nomination papers and collect signatures.
- 👉 **STEP 3:**
File nomination papers with the Town Clerk. Deadline August 9 (*may be extended to August 14 if no incumbent files*).
