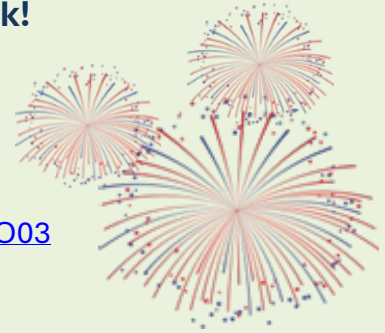

## National Pollinator Week

**Pollinator Week** was initiated and is managed by *Pollinator Partnership*, and fourteen years ago the U.S. Senate's unanimous approval and designation of a week in June as "*National Pollinator Week*" marked a necessary step toward addressing the urgent issue of declining pollinator populations. Pollinator Week has now grown into an international celebration, promoting the valuable ecosystem services provided by bees, birds, butterflies, bats, beetles, moths, wasps, and flies.

The 2025 Pollinator Poster, "*Pollinators Weave Connections*" focuses on the vital role that pollinators play in various aspects of our lives and cultures. They are essential for producing many foods, including fruits, vegetables, spices, and nuts. Many Indigenous communities have long recognized the importance of pollinators not only for their ecological contributions but also as a foundation for cultural symbolism.
