PUBLIC WORKS PROJECTS AND UPDATES

CANYON ROAD BRIDGE TRAFFIC DELAYS – TUESDAY, JULY 20

The contractor is working on forming the stem and soffit and preparing for the critical early morning mass concrete pour on Tuesday, July 20, starting at 4:00 am and expected to last till 4:00 pm. MORAGA ROAD CLOSURE – CITY OF LAFAYETTE PAVING PROJECT

The City of Lafayette will be starting the Moraga Road and Reliez Valley Road repaving projects the week of July 26. This project is anticipated to be completed in late October and will impact traffic on Reliez Valley Road and Moraga Road. COUNCIL CHAMBERS TRELLIS APPROVED

The Town of Moraga Planning Commission reviewed and approved the proposed Moraga Town Council Chamber Trellis project. The project will provide shade and cover for overflow outdoor seating during Council meetings and events. The project consists of installing a pergola over the central patio area in front of the Council Chambers entrance between the two existing pergolas and will be consistent in appearance and construction with the existing pergolas. The plans will now be submitted to Contra Costa County for review and issuance of building permits.

LAGUNA CREEK RESTORATION PROJECT 30% DESIGN

The Laguna Creek Restoration Project design is 30% complete. The draft 30% design plans will be presented to the Moraga Town Council on August 25 for further feedback.

LAGUNA CREEK RESTORATION PROJECT CEQA ANALYSIS

The California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) [Initial Study/Mitigated Negative Declaration \(IS/MND\)](#) analysis for the Laguna Creek Restoration Project has been completed. RECENT TOWN COUNCIL ACTIONS ON JULY 14, 2021

ADVANCED PLANNING INITIATIVE CONTRACT AND COMMUNITY OUTREACH

Town Council considered and adopted a resolution approving a professional services agreement for the Comprehensive Advanced Planning Initiative for the Housing Element, Environmental Impact Report, Rezone (including Bollinger Valley Study Area) and General Plan Update. The Council supported a robust outreach effort which will utilize additional Town Council, Planning Commission, focus groups, stakeholder meetings, and social media for input and feedback. MORAGA-ORINDA FIRE DISTRICT (MOFD) LETTER

Town Council directed staff to send a [letter to MOFD](#) from the Town of Moraga opposing an increase in the Fire Flow Tax (FFT) for the Moraga Fire Flow Tax zone and urging MOFD not to spend taxpayer dollars on an expensive analysis to explore changes to the integrated system to deliver fire services that benefits ratepayers in all areas of the Moraga-Orinda Fire District. MOFD is scheduled to discuss the FFT rate at its upcoming meeting on July 21, 2021.

TOWN COUNCIL PROTOCOLS AMENDMENT

Town Council directed staff to change the order of the agenda to move Discussion Items closer to the end of the agenda.

PUBLIC ARTWORK DONATION

Town Council authorized the installation of a new art sculpture, “Wings” by artist Patrick E., for Rancho Laguna Park. The addition of this sculpture to the Town’s permanent collection was made possible by a generous donation from the [Moraga Garden Club](#). The installation will be placed adjacent to the new Monarch butterfly pollinator garden to promote public awareness of the [Moraga for Monarchs program](#).

1049 CAMINO PABLO IMPROVEMENTS AND RIGHT-OF-WAY DEDICATION

The Town Council accepted improvements and an irrevocable offer of right-of-way dedication for the property located at 1049 Camino Pablo in accordance with the Subdivision Improvement Agreement for Minor Subdivision (MS) 601-14. The improvements included portions of sidewalk along Camino Pablo adjacent to 1049 Camino Pablo and a driveway entrance.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT MEETINGS

Town Council accepted the Mayor and Vice Mayor’s [report](#) on their “Community Engagement Tour” which included information and feedback collected from participants at ten community meetings and through a survey. The five top issues in Moraga identified in the survey were: retail services, financial management, development/open space, infrastructure and retail “look.”



TOWN RECEIVES \$2,127,036 OF ARPA FUNDS

On March 11, 2021, a \$1.9 trillion Federal stimulus bill was passed called the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA). The economic recovery package includes \$130 billion for local governments to help provide continued assistance for public health response and lay the foundation for a strong and equitable economic recovery. In July, the Town received \$2.125 million, or 50%, of its \$4.25 million allotment. The Fiscal Year 2021/22 Budget includes a \$270,000 reimbursement of ARPA funds to the General Fund for revenue loss and COVID-19 related costs, \$976,119 for storm drain maintenance and capital improvement projects, and \$50,904 for broadband improvements.



EBMUD FLOOD CONTROL PROJECT

EBMUD has obtained all necessary permits to begin work on the Moraga Creek Flood and Erosion Control Project. A biological survey was completed on July 14. EBMUD is expecting to issue the Notice to Commence Field Work (NTCFW) to Condon Johnson this week; project work may begin as early as the week of July 19.
