TOWN COUNCIL ACTIONS ON APRIL 26, 2023

LIBRARY CARPET REPLACEMENT

Town Council resolutions were approved for the Moraga Library Carpet Replacement Project (CIP 21-107). These resolutions awarded contract services agreements for carpet removal and install, furniture moving, and shelving removal/relocation, as well as authorizing the Town Manager to execute these agreements and change orders up to 10% of the total contract amount. They additionally accepted a \$27,000 Donation from Friends of the Moraga Library for shelving and book moving. The County Board of Supervisors must now approve the library closure. Once this is complete, the public will be given notice prior to the 6-8 week Library closure.

DETERMINING THE ANNUAL NPDES ASSESSMENT

The Town Council continued the Town's Equivalent Runoff Unit (ERU) assessment rate at \$35 per ERU, known as National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) funding. The \$35 per ERU rate is the maximum currently allowed and has been in place since Fiscal Year 2003/04. The assessment is collected by the Contra Costa County Flood Control & Water Conservation District to fund the Contra Costa Clean Water Program (CCCWP) and the Town's programs for compliance with the Federal Clean Water Act.

BOLLINGER CANYON SPECIAL STUDY AREA

Town Council resolutions approved to rezone the 423-acre Bollinger Canyon through CEQA findings and Statement of Overriding Considerations and text amendments to the Moraga General Plan. A first reading of the ordinance creates a Rural Residential District with 1 dwelling unit per 5 acres (1/5DUA). The rezoning adopts General Plan designations and zoning regulations that will govern future projects. The area is comprised of 20 parcels and is grouped into 3 separate groups; Parcel Group 1 is mostly existing homes with 1 DUA, Parcel Group 2 is the Harvey Ranch dedicated to open space, and Parcel Group 3 is 270 acres proposed as Rural Residential. MORAGA COMMUNITY FAIRE AND CAR SHOW

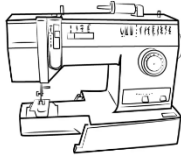
